13.30 Leave from English in Chester for a guided tour of **Port Sunlight**, one of the world's first purpose built towns which was designed by Lord Leverhulme to house all the workers in his nearby soap factory. The village has been maintained exactly how it was when it was first built. You can also visit the art gallery if you wish, which has a fantastic collection of British and European paintings and sculptures.

CONWY AND BODNANT GARDEN

10.00 Leave from English in Chester and drive along the North Wales coast. We will be back in Chester about 18.00.

Conwy is a beautiful seaside town of huge importance in English and Welsh history. Built between 1283 and 1287 by Edward I, Conwy Castle is a spectacular example of a strategic medieval fortress. Conwy itself is the most outstanding walled town in Britain. This vibrant, lively town is great to wander around and a nice ice cream by the sea is always a highlight! Other attractions include Plas Mawr — an excellent example of an Elizabethan town house, and the smallest house in Wales.

Bodnant Garden is one of the most beautiful gardens in the UK, spanning some 80 acres situated above the River Conwy. Enjoy a pleasant walk round these interesting gardens, where you can see a wide variety of beautiful flowers, shrubs and trees.
