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Teacher Training

University of Cambridge CELTA

The CELTA (University of Cambridge TEFL) course is the most widely recognized English language teaching qualification worldwide, and International House Dublin is the longest running CELTA centre in Dublin! We offer both full and part-time courses, all of which are externally assessed by a University of Cambridge ESOL moderator, thus ensuring that all of our candidates receive the best standard possible for your teacher training programme.

The CELTA course is aimed at a range of candidates including:

- Candidates entirely new to teaching.
- Candidates who have taught languages, but with little or no previous training.
- Candidates who have taught other subjects and wish to take up language teaching.
- Candidates who have received previous training in language teaching, but feel the need for a refresher course, for a more practical qualification, or for a more internationally recognized qualification.

Course length

- Full-time CELTA: 4 weeks
- Part-time CELTA: 15 weeks

Class timetable

- Full-Time CELTA: Monday to Friday, 9:00 17:15
- Part-Time CELTA : Flexible schedule for online input sessions, to include interactive tasks, collaborative tasks in discussion forums, live sessions, observations of filmed lessons, assignments and tutorials. Teaching practice with language learners are fixed in two blocks, according to specified dates.

Teacher Refresher Course

Our Teachers' Refresher Course is designed for teachers whose first language is not English and who wish to refresh their English language skills, while simultaneously exploring new methodologies and different approaches to teaching a language. This course consists of lectures, workshops and communicative sessions. It is perfect for teachers who wish to take home lots of practical ideas and activities, to use with their own students.

This course is recognized for funding under the Erasmus+ Programme.

Typical sample sessions include:

- Lesson frameworks
- Irish culture sessions
- Activities for language practice
- Authentic material
- Exploiting technology

CLIL Programme

Our Teacher Refresher CLIL programme is designed for teachers whose first language is not English to refresh their English language skills while simultaneously exploring the principles behind CLIL. It is perfect for teachers who wish to take home lots of practical ideas and activities, to use with their own students.

This course is recognised for funding under the Erasmus+ Programme.

Participants on this programme will:

- Develop an understanding of the principles behind CLIL
- Consider methodology, lesson frameworks, teaching strategies and skills for use with CLIL
- Evaluate, adapt, and design materials for language learning in a CLIL subject

Integrating ICT into Language

Our Integrating ICT into Language Education programme is designed for teachers whose first language is not English, to refresh their English language skills while simultaneously exploring the role and use of digital technology within today's educational context. This course consists of lectures, workshops and communicative sessions, providing practical tools for teachers to use with their own students.

This course is recognised for funding under the Erasmus+ Programme.

Suitable for secondary school teachers, this course will include the following elements

- Internet skills and literacies
- Impact of technology on language teaching methodologies
- The use of mobile and handheld learning in the classroom
- Use of learner management systems
- The role of technology in teacher development
- Making the most of apps and social media in class
- The detailed course content will be agreed upon before each session according to the needs and requests of the participants.

<u>Co-operation Strategies and Emotional</u> <u>Intelligence for Educators</u>

Our Co-operation Strategies and Conflict Management Programme is designed for teachers whose first language is not English, to refresh their English language skills while simultaneously exploring the role of co-operation and conflict in today's educational context. This course consists of lectures, workshops and communicative sessions. This course is recognised for funding under the Erasmus+ Programme.

Participants on this programme will:

- Consider the role of self-esteem in creating a positive learning and teaching environment
- Consider the role of creative and dynamic learning in generating and maintaining motivation
- Examine the role emotional intelligence plays in developing co-operating strategies and conflict management
- Understand how teachers, students, schools and families can co-operate to create a positive learning environment.
- Examine ways to engender empathy and consider its role in diffusing conflict
- Understand group dynamics and discuss positive outcomes of conflict
- Evaluate and experiment with different methods of team building

Accommodation

Homestay

Living in a homestay is the best way for students to practise their spoken English every day and to experience the world-famous Irish hospitality.

Host families are carefully selected by the International House Accommodation team, and are located in safe, residential areas within easy access to IH Dublin via public transport. Homestay accommodation is available to all of our students year round, including half-board, and with options of booking a single, double, or twin room. Bed linen is provided, as well as access to laundry facilities once per week.

Residential

IH Dublin offers a range of high quality, self-catering apartments all year round in the city centre through our partner providers. These apartments are open to students ages 18 and above and are within easy access to the school, either walking or by public transport.
