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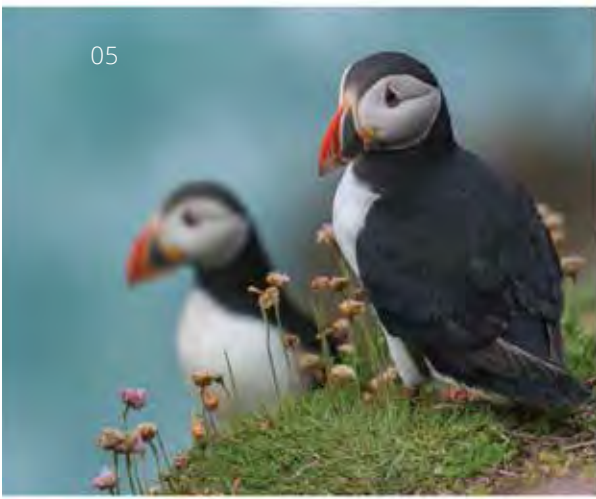

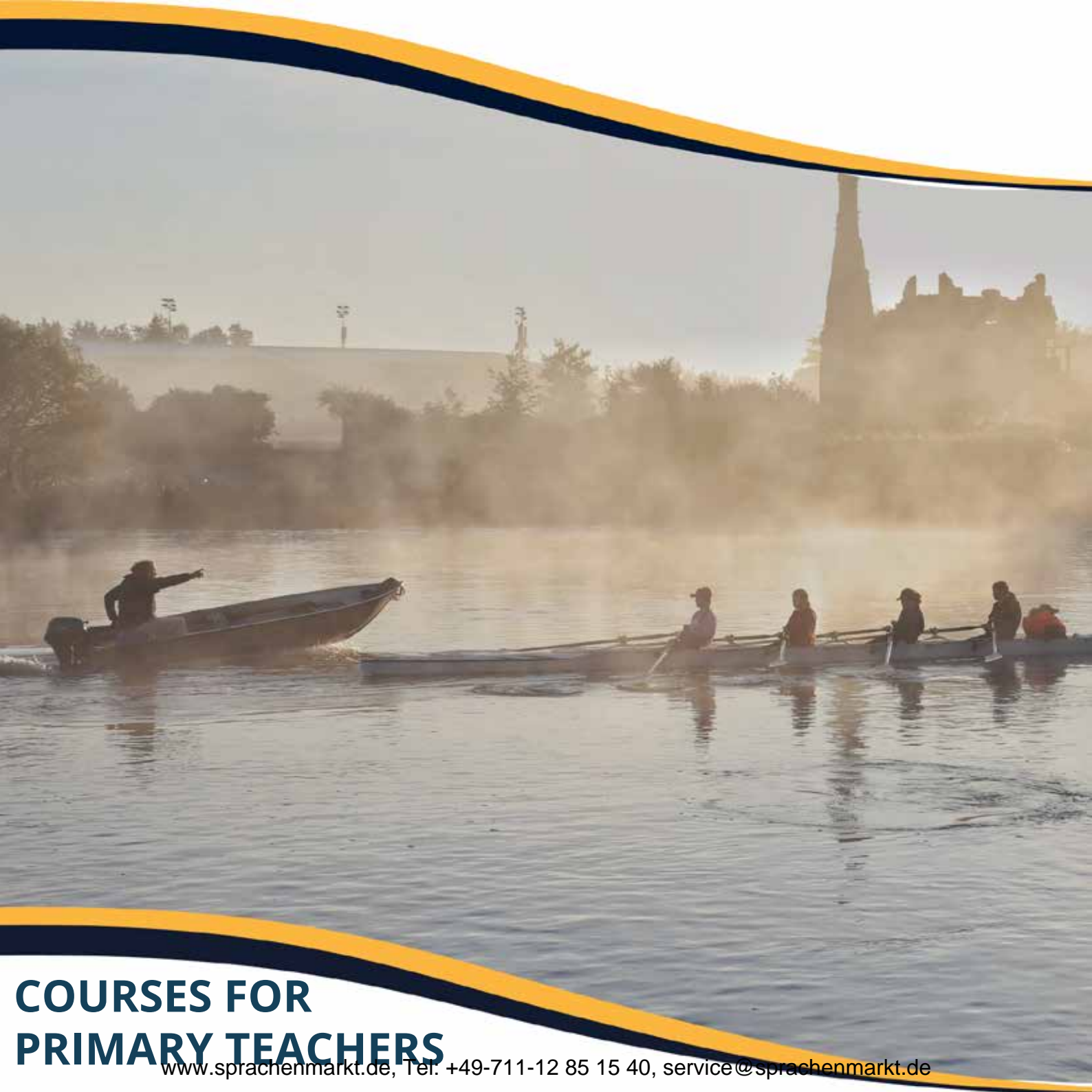

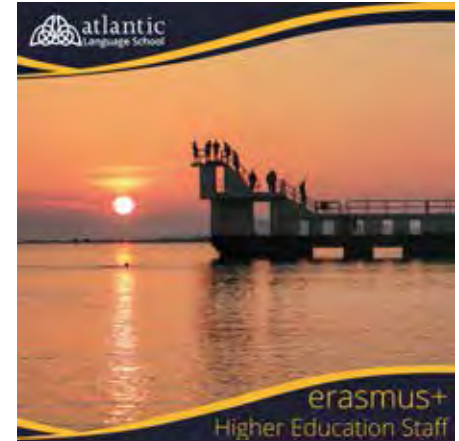

Mobility Exchange

Atlantic Language sends trainers to European HEIs as part of funded mobility exchange workshops to enhance the development of internationalization in hosting organizations. Past mobilities include training in areas such as CLIL methodology, English for Specific Purposes and adaptive in-hours training.

Internships

Career development opportunities for students and graduates are available. Atlantic Language is a recognised host of year-round mobility-funded (KA1) training internships in Ireland, offering a range of postings to develop skills in areas such as marketing, client services, academic organization and administration.

Research
