COURSES FOR TEACHERS OF ENGLISH TO PUPILS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS PORTSMOUTH, ENGLAND & DUBLIN, IRELAND 2021

Teachers of English to pupils (aged 7-16) with special needs (learning difficulties) are invited to attend this course.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

This course aims to provide teachers with:

- a range of new ideas, practical classroom skills and materials for teaching English to pupils with special needs
- an opportunity to improve their own language skills and to acquire language for the classroom
- an insight into Special Education in Britain or Ireland
- an opportunity to exchange ideas and develop links with teachers from other European countries
- cultural background to life in Britain or Ireland

COURSE CONTENT:

1. Practical Methodology Workshops on Teaching English as a Foreign Language to Special Needs Pupils conducted by expert teacher trainers with many years of experience in training European teachers of English and a wealth of exciting ideas to impart.

Emphasis will be on motivating pupils through a variety of activities which engage their imaginations and creativity. Plenty of practical ideas will be demonstrated and considered and teachers will be encouraged to participate.

Many aspects will be covered including:

Developing listening & speaking skills; Songs, rhymes & chants; poems; Drama and role play; Storytelling activities; TPR (Total Physical Response) Activities; Games; Drawing and craft activities; using pictures Teaching vocabulary; CLIL (Content and Language Integrated Learning); Increasing motivation; Learner autonomy; Co-operative learning; Using authentic materials; Correction and feedback strategies; Textbooks; Using new technologies.

A wide range of ready-made teaching materials will be provided.

- 2. English Language Training including Listening and Speaking Skills, Pronunciation and Intonation, Grammar Review, Vocabulary
- 3. Classroom Language: Vocabulary, Expressions and Role Play for the Special Needs Classroom

4. The Education System:

- a lecture on the English or Irish Education System focusing on Special Needs
- day visit(s) to school(s) with an opportunity to observe lessons:
 - visit a special school and / or visit a primary or secondary school with integrated special needs pupils.
- 5. Discussion session: draw comparisons between Special Education in England or Ireland and participants' own countries; opportunity for teachers of different nationalities to exchange experiences.
- 6. Educational visit to Winchester from Portsmouth or Cultural visits in Dublin.

LOCATIONS:

PORTSMOUTH, England: Population: 207,000; 75 miles (120 kilometres) south-west of London (1¹/₂ hours by rail).

Portsmouth, situated on the south coast, is an important port, famous for its historic ships - most notably Nelson's "Victory". Old Portsmouth overlooks the busy historic maritime harbour, while the attractive seaside resort area of Southsea, with its parks and gardens and two piers, has four miles of seafront with views across to the Isle of Wight.

DUBLIN, Ireland: Population: 1,228,000.

Famous for its cultural heritage and charming hospitality, Dublin is a lively city with a rich history, situated on the east coast of Ireland. Notable historic sights include its elegant Georgian squares, Dublin Castle, Christ Church Cathedral, the Book of Kells at Trinity College, Kilmainham Gaol and National Museums. Temple Bar is a busy riverside neighbourhood with live Irish folk music venues.

Close to the city are the beautiful hills and lakes of Wicklow Mountains National Park and attractive coastal scenery.

(a) COURSE FEE: to include:

Full programme of study sessions and visits as itemised above.

NB. Participants are responsible for paying their own daily transport costs, including transport to schools. Optional visits are not included in the price.

(b) HOST FAMILY ACCOMMODATION: to include:

Full board accommodation with a local family (inclusive of registration fee): 7 or 13 nights (Teachers may request to be the only guest of their mother tongue or to stay in the same family as a colleague).

Host families are carefully selected and offer a friendly welcome and opportunities to chat and learn more about life in Britain or Ireland today. Participants often find that the experience of staying with a host family is one of the most memorable aspects of the course. Accommodation is in single rooms (unless participants request to share). Breakfast, packed lunch and evening meal are provided by the host family. (Food allergies, likes and dislikes are taken into account.)

Please note that many of the suitable residential areas are not within walking distance of the town centre, and most host families are an easy bus ride from the town centre/tuition centre. Local transport from host families to the town centre and local schools is at the participants' own expense and is likely to cost 15-40 Euro per week.

Additional nights with host families can be arranged, giving participants extra time for individual research and visits. Accommodation can be provided for family members (but not unaccompanied children) subject to availability. (Rates on request).

On other courses participants wishing to arrange their own (hotel or self-catering) accommodation may pay a fee for the course only.

PAYMENT:

Full payment will be due 2 months before the course begins, or for teachers awaiting funding: as soon as the grant is received. No refund for cancellations within 5 weeks of arrival. Applicants are strongly advised to take out cancellation insurance. Postponement due to Covid-19 will be possible if necessary.

TRAVEL:

Transport at the beginning and end of the course is not provided and InterEducation regrets that it is unable to assist with travel arrangements. The most convenient airports for Portsmouth: Southampton (rail to Portsmouth), Heathrow (direct National Express coach to Portsmouth) or Gatwick (direct coach or rail to Portsmouth).

If arriving at other airports, travel to the course location is generally via central London by coach or rail.

PREPARATION:

Participants complete a detailed questionnaire before the course starts to ascertain their level of experience and training, as well as the age groups and types of learners they teach. Suggestions for pre-course reading are given.

EVALUATION:

At the end of the course teachers participate in a detailed evaluation of the course.

FOLLOW UP:

At the end of the course teachers are asked to consider which aspects of the course will be the most relevant to their own teaching situations. On their return they are invited to keep a record of how they have been able to utilise ideas gained on the course in their own classrooms. They are encouraged to share their experiences with their fellow participants by email. Teachers will also have email access to the teacher trainers for discussion and advice after the course.
