Spanish Courses

Group Lessons (20 hours a week)

With a maximum of 7 people in each group class, we ensure that you receive personalized instruction, participate in class activities and discussions, and make a connection with your professor.

Private Lessons (10-20 hours a week)

Receive one-on-one attention. Private lessons are an excellent idea for professionals seeking a specialized vocabulary for specific situations and can be a more concentrated alternative than group classes.

Group + Private (25-30 hours a week)

Supplement the standard mini-group class with additional private lessons. You may review a difficult area or focus on a specialized topic in your career or interests.



DELE Exam Preparation

If you are seeking international recognition as a Spanish speaker with DELE, ECELA will prepare you.

DELE Diploma

The Diploma de Español como Lengua Extranjera (DELE) is the official, international degree of fluency in Spanish. It is recognized by the Ministry of Education and Culture of Spain and prepared and evaluated by the University of Salamanca. Certification in any of the three levels of DELE will provide any aspiring graduate student or person seeking employment the opportunity to work in a Spanish speaking occupation.

Levels of Instruction and Academic Credit

Our complete Spanish course consists of 12 two week components.

Beginner levels: Gaining a solid foundation of spoken and written Spanish will help you navigate simple, everyday conversations and situations by instructing you in proper pronunciation, basic vocabulary, key words, greetings and phrases.

Intermediate levels: Learning to express yourself with more complex phrases in the conditional, future and subjunctive tenses will be the focus of the Intermediate levels, and further development of grammar and comprehension will make you a confident and competent communicator by the end of these levels.

Advanced and Superior levels: Perfecting your language skills will be the goal of the final set of classes, as you polish all of your Spanish communication through composition, analysis of literature, learning more specific and complex vocabulary and discussing various social themes.

Electives: Private elective courses in literature, history and composition are available to advanced-level students. Literature and history have a Latin American focus, while composition will help you learn how to compose a variety of different works, from business letters to essays. You may also choose to attend our free weekly courses on local culture, history, literature and phrases to help you understand the country and the language even more.



Academic Credit

Study for a summer, semester or any amount of time that suits you. Each four week ECELA block is equal to a college semester course.

For students interested in a more traditional academic semester or summer abroad program, we offer university credit programs in all of our school locations.

Standard Programs - College Credit

You will be able to earn college credit from four to 36 weeks of group, private or super-intensive courses. We are affiliated with universities in Chile, Argentina and the U.S.

We have hosted students who received college credit for completion of ECELA courses from more than 100 U.S. and Canadian Universities.

Peru, Cusco

At an altitude of almost 11,000 feet, Cusco's fresh, Andean mountain air and intimate atmosphere will put you at ease. The history of the city as the former capital of the Inca Empire survives today, as you will be able to see the Temple of the Sun and many more pieces of Inca architecture that were sacred to the Incas and are sacred to today's residents.

But Cusco entertains with more than ancient ruins and Spanish colonial architecture. The city's *fútbol* stadium, which hosted to the 2004 American Cup, is the home of one of Peru's most popular teams, Cienciano, and world-class Peruvian cuisine can be sampled from numerous restaurants. As the city has grown, so have your nightlife options.

Cusco also provides the perfect jump-off point for expeditions into Peru's varied natural landscape of mountains, jungles and plains, and the breathtaking view of Machu Picchu is an unforgettable experience.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Will I find other students around my age?

A: You will find students from every stage of life. We have hosted many teens and many adventurous seniors, and you will consistently find a broad diversity of ages at the school and activities and courses geared towards all specific tastes.

Q: What's the advantage about studying in more than one country?

A: Experiencing the cultural and dialectic differences of Argentina, Chile and Peru will give you a better understanding of South America and Spanish in general. Plus, you'll get to see more exciting things, as each school location offers totally unique attractions! Tango in its homeland of Argentina; world-famous Chilean wine; indigenous culture and ruins in Peru.

Homestay or Student Housing?

A: A homestay will ensure that you practice Spanish and give you a firsthand experience of everyday Latin American life. The student housing option gives you the opportunity to make new friends from all over the world and constant company to do excursions and activities, but you may find it harder to practice your Spanish.

What can I do outside of class?

A: You will never be short of things to do with ECELA. Our five schools are located in areas that are surrounded with exciting possibilities for daytime, nightlife and weekend excursion activities. Whether that means appreciating the mountain activities of Mendoza, visting an art exhibit in Buenos Aires or taking salsa or cueca lessons in Santiago, our Activities Coordinators make sure to immerse you in South American culture. Although we recommend our school activities, there is no need to hesitate to go discover the area on your own or with friends as well.

Q: How is the day structured?

A: Our classes start at 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. and last for four hours with two breaks. Our afternoon activities are scheduled around the standard class schedule, so while your course work will take up a portion of your time, you may choose guided or independent activities at your discretion.

Q: What do I need to bring for class?

A: Your textbooks are supplied in each level, but you should bring a Spanish dictionary, notebook, and pens to take notes.

Q: Final advice before I leave?

1. Read about the culture of the country to help you avoid culture shock.
2. Make sure that your passport is valid for at least six months after the end of your program.
3. Let us know if you are receiving any ongoing medical treatment.
4. Begin to train your ear to Spanish. If you have access to Spanish radio or TV stations, play them in the background when possible. Even if you are a beginner, just hearing people speak Spanish will help, whether or not you understand it.
5. As the saying goes, bring half the clothes you think you'll need, but twice the money.
