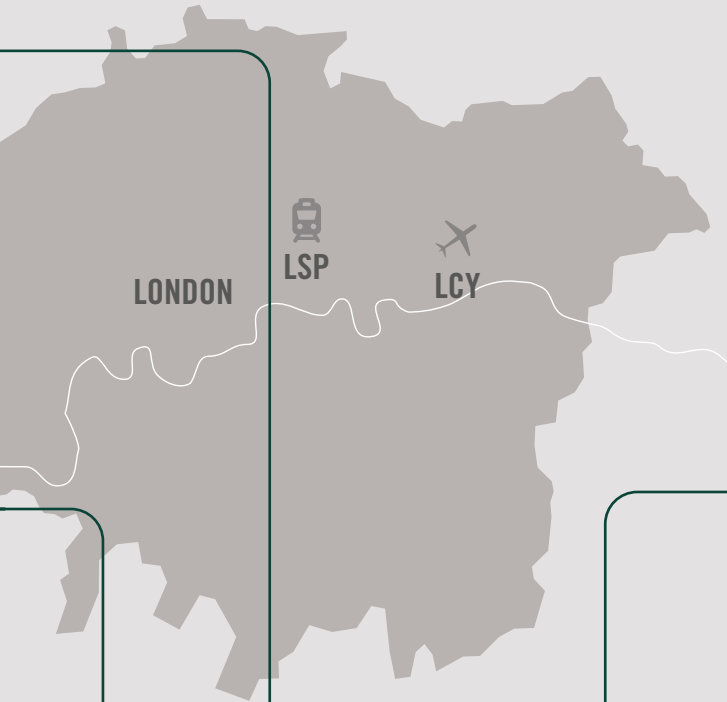

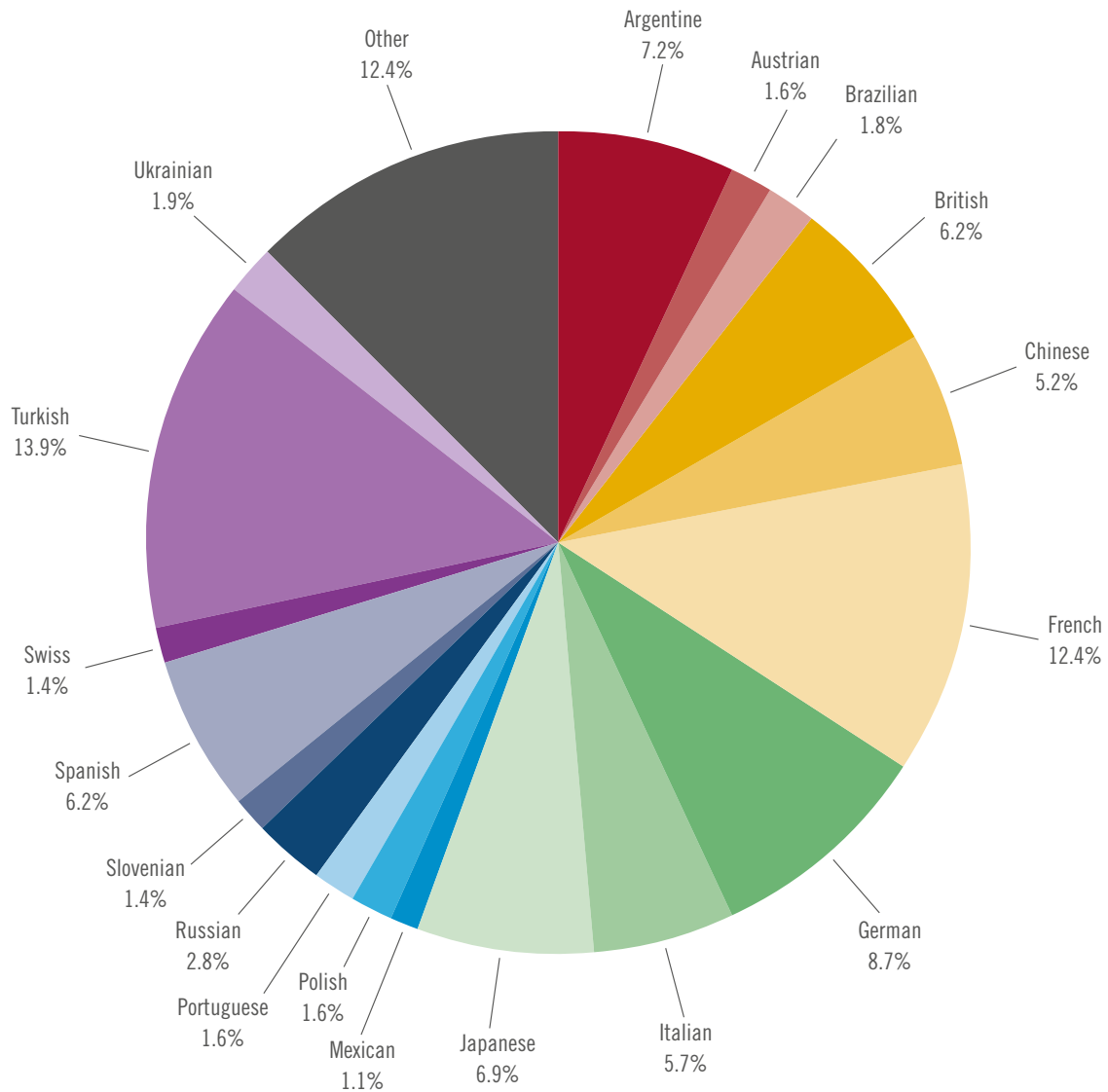

Since our school began, Bede's has had philanthropy rooted at its very core and many pupils have benefited from transformational bursaries, demonstrating that our core ethos of Compassion, Courage, Conscientiousness and Curiosity is a living and breathing part of everything that we do. In September 2022 we created the Bede's Transformational Bursary Fund, and in June 2023 launched the Bede's Development Foundation.

The mission of this campaign is to create in excess of twenty 110% Sixth Form transformational bursaries by 2029; the Senior School's 50th anniversary at The Dicker. A Bede's transformational bursary is worth 110% and targets those from the most disadvantaged backgrounds and covers a pupil's fees, transport, uniform and co-curricular programme so that they face no barrier to the opportunities Bede's provides when they take up their place with us. Making our bursaries truly transformational.

For every week booked at the Bede's Summer School, £20 is donated to the Bede's Transformational Bursary Fund, which means together the Summer School will fund two 110% transformational bursaries a year for those most in need.

Bede's Staff

We recognise the key role staff play in making the student experience at Bede's Summer School special and memorable. That's why Bede's carefully select staff who are friendly and enthusiastic, with the skills, experience and passion to bring out the best from the students in our care.

Each centre has a minimum of four senior managers on site:

- **Centre Director**, who oversees all aspects of the school;
- **Academic Manager**, to ensure the delivery of engaging and motivating academic programmes;
- **Welfare Manager**, to look after the students physical and emotional well-being; and
- **Activity Manager**, who is responsible for a varied, enjoyable and inspiring programme of sports, activities, academies, social events and excursions.

Every staff member receives a thorough induction to ensure they are fully prepared for their role. Since most staff are residential, they are available 24 hours a day providing a high standard of pastoral care for all students.

Bede's aim is to inspire students, widening their horizons and giving them opportunities to make international friendships, whilst also improving their English language skills.

Safeguarding & Student Care



Safeguarding and the health and well-being of our students is the top priority across the Summer School. All Summer School staff receive training from the Director of Safeguarding and Designated Safeguarding Lead. This training ensures that every member of staff is fully aware of their role and responsibility in maintaining student safety.

A qualified registered nurse will be available to provide medical care and dispense medicines. We ask parents/guardians to notify us in advance of any pre-existing conditions and prescription drug needs. Many of the staff are first aid trained so they are able to deal with small incidents which may occur during activities and excursions. An emergency 24/7 contact number is provided to every student and parent/guardian.

Students are looked after day and night by our on-site, dedicated staff. Each centre has a Welfare Manager and a team of House Parents who work closely together to make sure students feel happy and supported during their stay.

Academic Programme

At Bede's Summer School we deliver excellence in student academic programmes. Students learn and develop their love of English through stimulating lessons taught by qualified, enthusiastic and committed teachers.

Each of our centres and courses has a closely defined age range that facilitates the design and delivery of a relevant, challenging and constructive syllabus in line with the Bede's mission. To ensure a rich and diverse international student community, our aim is to maintain a 20% language cap on student enrolments. This approach helps to promote a multicultural environment in every class.

LESSONS

Each course has a different academic curriculum tailored to the age range of the centre. The number of hours of English tuition also varies, depending on the course. Please visit the relevant course pages in the prospectus for further information.

PLACEMENT TEST

Students take a placement test on arrival to confirm their English level. They will then be placed into appropriate classes according to their level and age at the start of the programme.

PROGRESS TEST

Progress tests are carried out by the teachers at the end of each week to monitor and review students' progress and make any necessary adjustments for the following week.

LEVELS

Under the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR), eight levels are

available from A0 (Complete Beginner) to C2 (Proficiency). If a Course or Academy has a minimum level requirement it will be stated on the supplementary information.

SYLLABUS

The Bede's syllabus offers varied, current and relevant topics to engage, motivate and inspire students. The syllabus is tailored to students' ages, needs and interests to ensure efficient learning.

TEACHERS

Bede's English teachers are suitably qualified according to the Accreditation UK criteria. They are carefully selected during



the Recruitment process and undergo lesson observations and take part in continuous professional development during their time at Bede's.

METHODOLOGY

The teaching methodology is communicative and interactive, with creativity and personal expression encouraged. Students participate actively in enjoyable and engaging activities to encourage confidence in spoken English.

OUTCOMES

We present course completion certificates and academic reports, as well as achievement awards in Bede's Leavers' Ceremony, not just for academic achievements, but also to recognise effort and improvement in other areas.

TUTORIALS

Tutorials are available on Friday afternoons, giving students the opportunity to discuss their academic progress with their teachers in one-to-one meetings.



Exams

Bede's Summer School offers a number of intensive exam courses to allow students to obtain a professional qualification to certify their English level in preparation for future academic study or for their future career.

All exam courses are run as two-week programmes and include dedicated exam preparation instead of regular English lessons. Students sit the exam during their Bede's course, normally in the last week.

The exam registration fees are included in the exam course fee. Special arrangements need to be requested with a minimum of 8 weeks advance, subject to availability.

On-site Activities & Academies

At Bede's Summer School, we believe that students learn just as much outside of the classroom as they do inside of it. Our on-site activity programme is key to this approach. Students will enjoy a wide range of engaging activities that make the most of the high-quality facilities available at all Bede's Summer School sites.

Bede's Summer School understands that all students have different interests. With that in mind, our programmes are designed to have something for everyone that works to the social and cultural benefit of our students combining sports, arts and crafts and challenging competitions.

Each of our boarding school summer centres has an on-site indoor swimming pool, sports hall and fields, as well as multi-purpose indoor spaces for showcases and workshops to host the wide array of activities that students will enjoy. Our superb sites allow us to offer varied and exciting activities and evening events in first-class surroundings.

Academies offer professional tuition in a range of sports, leisure pursuits, creative activities and academic subjects, and are designed to increase students' skills, technique and knowledge. Our portfolio of optional Academies perfectly exemplifies our approach towards student-centred learning and programme design. Each student can customise their experience at Bede's with the opportunity to extend and expand their learning in and out of the classroom in small, supervised groups under expert tuition.

Academies can bring many benefits to the students, such as stimulating their creativity, expanding their capacity for reflection and helping them to develop their critical thinking skills. Some raise students' fitness levels and ability, while others help students to improve their self-confidence by challenging them to step outside of their comfort zone. Every Academy, whether it be a sport, creative activity, leisure pursuit or academic subject, will help students to develop their communication skills, confidence in speaking and fluency.

Excursions are an integral part of the Bede's Summer School programme and no two weeks are ever the same! We offer students a complimentary mix of visits to places of cultural and historical interest, as well as chances for sightseeing, shopping and amusement.

With our carefully defined age ranges, excursions across the summer are tailored to the interests of students and are age-appropriate.

Excursions are organised either three or four times a week, depending on the centre. Midweek excursions are half-day visits to local places of interest or to an amusement park or an activity centre, such as bowling or treetop high ropes and zip wires.

Saturday excursions are a full-day trip and include a cultural, tourist or recreational visit to London. A sightseeing option is offered every week to ensure that students get the chance to experience the capital's most famous landmarks.

Sunday excursions are often more relaxing trips to a local Sussex seaside town such as Eastbourne, Brighton or Hastings. Students can walk along the beach, have lunch in the park or do some shopping whilst enjoying the sights and attractions on offer.

Day Courses

Bede's Day Courses are a great non-residential option for students who are coming to England with their parents/guardians on a family holiday looking to enjoy the Sussex coast for a summer experience.

PROGRAMME

Offered across all Bede's centres and programmes, Day Courses run from 8.30 to 17.00 Monday to Friday, with a later return on midweek excursion days. Half-day excursions on Wednesdays are included in Eastbourne, Windlesham, Dicker and Lancing, and half-day excursions on Tuesdays and Thursdays are included in Brighton. Students may add the evening option (includes dinner and evening social events) on a daily basis and may also join the Saturday and Sunday excursions (supplements payable, see [Registration Form](#) for details).

LESSONS & ACTIVITIES

Day students will join the residential students in classes which are mixed to ensure they are learning with peers of different nationalities and of the same language ability and age. Day students will also join the varied and exciting on-site activity programme offered as part of the residential courses, or can add any of the available Academies onto their Day Course.







ACCOMMODATION

We recommend that families stay in the local area near our schools, with the closest towns being Eastbourne, Brighton or Worthing, all of which are located on the beautiful south coast of England. There is a range of options for either of the locations to suit every budget, from self-catering apartments to deluxe 5-star hotels. Families need to book their own accommodation.

ENGLISH LESSONS

English lessons are available for the parents of Little Explorers in Eastbourne. We offer lessons in small groups, catering for a variety of English levels (see [Registration Form](#) for details).

Classes are designed to improve parents' general language skills, extend their vocabulary and better their understanding of grammar to improve accuracy when producing spoken and written English.

With a beautiful setting at the foot of Beachy Head, an area of outstanding natural beauty, our Eastbourne centre overlooks the sea and is the term-time home of Bede's Preparatory School. This compact centre, founded as the first Bede's School in 1895, has the feel of a family home and offers a safe and welcoming environment for our youngest students. The academic, social and cultural programme is carefully designed to educate and inspire our youngest learners.

The Little Explorers course is full of lessons, activities, events and excursions that give students a great introduction to the UK. Lessons are in small classes with a syllabus and materials perfect for young learners. Activities make use of our outstanding facilities and are designed around the interests of younger students.

The evening entertainment programme provides an opportunity for recreation and fun and is designed to immerse students in the English language and culture in a stimulating and innovative way. Excursions enable students to visit places of interest. Students will go on a half-day trip on Wednesday afternoons and full-day trips on Saturdays and Sundays to our exciting range of historic, cultural and fun attractions and destinations.

ACCOMMODATION

Secure boarding houses have bedrooms accommodating 4–8 students that enable new friendships to form and help a sense of community to develop. Students share their bedroom with children of a similar age and from different countries. Bathrooms are shared and in close proximity to bedrooms.



Academics

This carefully crafted programme, with 17½ hours of lessons per week, consists of English Skills, StoryTime and Explorations, where students learn English through stimulating subjects such as Science, Maths, Geography, Art and History.

Lessons improve students' general language competencies (including grammar and vocabulary) while placing particular emphasis on communication, fluency and building confidence in the speaker.

ENGLISH SKILLS

These lessons are designed to improve students' general language skills, extend their vocabulary and better their understanding of grammar, to improve accuracy when producing spoken and written English.

STORYTIME

Working on several different children's stories per week, StoryTime lessons stimulate students' natural curiosity, develop their listening and speaking skills and extend their everyday vocabulary.

EXPLORATIONS

These lessons use CLIL methodology to develop students' English skills through a range of stimulating subjects such as Science, Maths, Geography, Art and History to enable the students to explore and develop their interaction skills.

STUDENT AMBASSADORS

Bede's carefully selects high-achieving, year-round students to help in lessons. Under the guidance of our teachers, our ambassadors support students in the development of their communication and interaction skills.

SPORTS & ACTIVITIES (AFTERNOONS)

After lessons, students participate in a variety of sports and recreational activities. Students will be able to choose their preferred sport or activity. Creative activities are particularly popular with this age group.

Examples are: Cake Baking, Clay Modelling, Dance, Football, Swimming, Table Tennis and Tie Die T-Shirts.

SOCIAL EVENTS (EVENINGS)

Social events are always the perfect time for students to mix and enjoy themselves with their new friends. At Eastbourne they include: Disco, Egg Drop Challenge, Fashion Show, Karaoke, Messy Games, Mini Olympics, Talent Show, and Treasure Hunt.

BEDE'S HOLIDAY CLUB

Bede's Holiday Club is a day activity camp for local British children to spend their summer at Bede's Eastbourne making friends with our Little Explorers!

Summer School students have the opportunity to interact during breaks, afternoon activities and mealtimes with children from the local community. This will help build their confidence and provide excellent practice for their English skills in real-life scenarios.



Academies

FILM & ANIMATION

Bede's Film & Animation Academy is a fun and interesting way to help young students reach their creative potential by creating a short film using Stop Motion animation techniques. Students begin by creating a story, set, and clay characters for their film, which they then photograph and physically move the objects within the frame to tell their story.

LEGO & CODING

Bede's LEGO & Coding Academy gives students the opportunity to combine creative building skills with the power of programming to design interactive and functional LEGO creations. LEGO & Coding is an exciting journey where creativity meets technology. As they explore this dynamic combination, students will expand their language skills, mastering the terminology and language needed to create, code, and communicate in the world of LEGO and technology.

HORSE RIDING

Students on the Bede's Horse Riding Academy will have a riding lesson and rides in the local countryside, under close supervision. The instructors are experienced in teaching young children for whom this may be their first time on a horse, as well as catering for more advanced riders. Students also have the opportunity to learn about caring for horses, grooming and stable management after their rides. Student height, weight, and experience level are required for this academy.

INDOOR CLIMBING

Bede's Indoor Climbing Academy enables students to develop strength, agility, and problem-solving skills through rock climbing in a safe indoor environment. With expert instructors guiding them, students will learn climbing techniques, safety protocols, and how to conquer challenging routes. Whether for fun or competitive interest, this academy provides a supportive space for young climbers to grow and push their limits.

SWIMMING

For students who enjoy swimming, the Bede's Swimming Academy will help improve their technique in a fun and structured environment. The academy also teaches water safety knowledge and increases overall confidence in the water.

TENNIS

Bede's Tennis Academy offers students the opportunity to improve their tennis skills and technique. Sessions will specifically look at offensive and defensive actions as well as how to position on court and improve their tennis ability.

ZOOKEEPER EXPERIENCE

Bede's Zookeeper Experience Academy offers students an opportunity to become a zookeeper at our very own zoo at the Dicker Centre. Students will help to care for the animals and learn about their welfare and behaviour. Bede's Zoo is home to 170 animals including binturongs, squirrel monkeys, lemurs, chinchillas, marmosets, guinea pigs and reptiles.

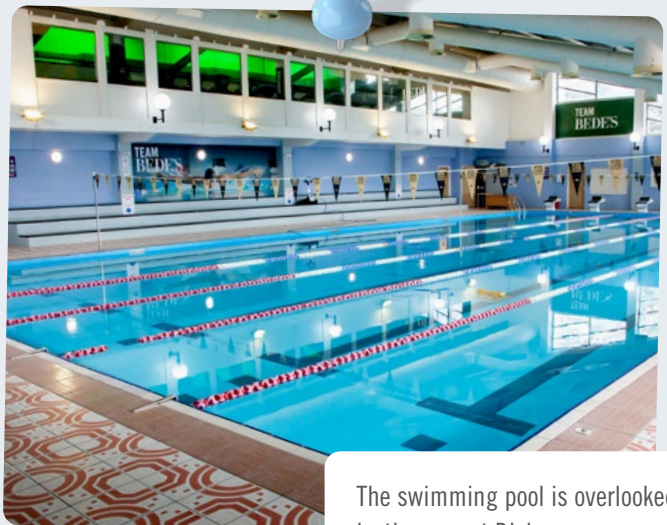

Academies

ESSAY WRITING








Catering for their individual enrichment needs can be quite a challenge as each animal has different requirements, as a snake isn't going to need the same enrichment as a Squirrel Monkey. As a school, we are enormously lucky to have such a facility in our portfolio. In Animal Management, students look after a range of zoo animals, and help with the dormouse breeding programme to increase numbers in the wild.

Students learn about animal welfare and ethics, animal health and disease, animal behaviour, practical animal husbandry and work experience in the land-based sector.

ANIMAL CARE & BEHAVIOUR

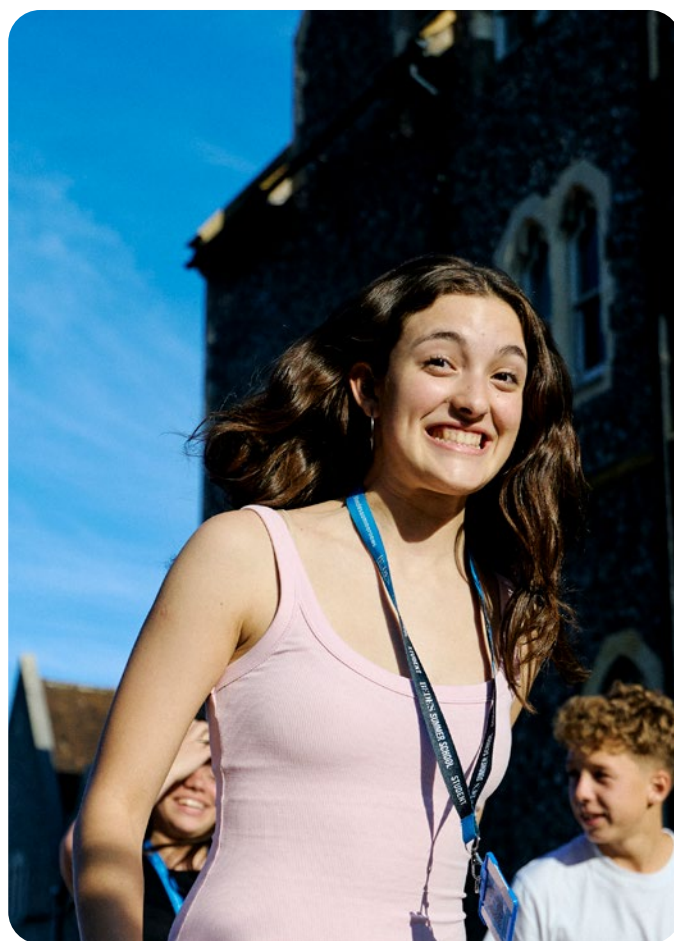

Academies

CRITICAL THINKING

Bede's Critical Thinking Academy is for students who enjoy the critical examination of information and ideas. They will learn how to make rational judgements and in the process develop their ability to think independently, and to express their viewpoint.

ESSAY WRITING

Bede's Essay Writing Academy teaches more than grammar and spelling. Students learn key writing structures for specific genres, and how to organise their ideas as well as the language needed to present and support those ideas in a logical and engaging way.

PSYCHOLOGY

Bede's Psychology Academy is for students who are curious about how the mind works and why people behave the way they do. Through interactive sessions and real-life case studies, students will explore key psychological theories and gain a deeper understanding of human thought, emotion and behaviour.

MASTERCHEF

Bede's Masterchef Academy is designed for students who have a passion for food and who enjoy cooking. The classes are fun and informative, giving students the confidence to be hands-on with raw produce and kitchen equipment. In each session, students create a dish inspired by a different international cuisine.



E-KART RACING

Bede's E-Kart Racing Academy offers students the chance to experience the thrill of electric kart racing while learning the fundamentals of speed, control, and strategy. Students will develop their driving skills and improve their reflexes in a safe and controlled environment. Whether aiming for fun or pursuing competitive racing, this academy provides an exciting introduction to the world of motorsport.

FLYING

Bede's Flying Academy offers students an opportunity to pilot an aircraft. Students will have a trained pilot in attendance for the 45-minute flight ensuring that they are able to take control of the aircraft should they need to. The main goal of this academy is to help students gain an understanding of how to pilot an aircraft and can help them with future flying lessons.

GOLF

Bede's Golf Academy is for students wishing to improve their golf technique supported by a professional instructor. The lessons will focus on developing the student's skills and knowledge of the game, practising and analysing the mechanics of the golf swing. Students will also broaden their vocabulary specifically relating to golf.

HORSE RIDING

Students on the Bede's Horse Riding Academy will have a riding lesson and rides in the local countryside, under close supervision. The instructors are experienced in teaching young children for whom this may be their first time on a horse as well as catering for more advanced riders. Students also have the opportunity to learn about caring for horses, grooming and stable management after their rides. Student height, weight, and experience level are required for this academy.

TENNIS

Bede's Tennis Academy offers students the opportunity to improve their tennis skills and technique, supported by a professional instructor. Sessions will specifically look at offensive and defensive actions as well as how to position on court and improve their tennis ability.

Business Leadership

This intensive two-week programme, available at Lancing, combines classroom-based teaching with practical visits to business organisations during specialised mid-week excursions.

Bede's Business Leadership course is designed to equip students with the essential skills and mindset needed to become a future leader in the dynamic world of business. Whether considering a career in finance, marketing, entrepreneurship, or management, this programme offers a unique opportunity to gain practical experience and theoretical knowledge in a fun, engaging, and collaborative environment.

Bede's students will not only develop core business knowledge but also acquire crucial 'soft skills' that are vital for success. Throughout the course, students will learn to communicate effectively, solve problems, and negotiate confidently. Through collaborative projects, students will enhance their teamwork abilities and learn how to motivate and inspire others. This comprehensive approach ensures students are not just learning theory but actively building the practical skills needed to lead with confidence and make a real impact.

PROGRAMME

Available in Lancing, the course includes 20 hours of classroom tuition each week, a fully guided visit to an organisation to gain an insight into the day-to-day reality of running a business and the opportunity to meet a guest speaker from the corporate world.

All sessions are delivered in English with a focus on broadening Business English vocabulary and technical language for course content.



ENGLISH FOR THE FUTURE

The morning English for the Future sessions develop the students' English language proficiency across the four skills with a particular focus on the global problems we are facing nowadays. Students will develop their presentation skills by watching TED Talks and preparing their own talks, as well as broadening their vocabulary related to sustainability and global issues.

FUTURE THINKING

These sessions prepare students for 'Friday for the Future' debates between two groups. Through a series of practical workshops on internet research and critical thinking, students will gather sufficient information on the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals and analyse it in order to offer practical solutions to global problems.

PROJECT FOR THE FUTURE

Over the course of a week, students will research and discuss one of the 2030 Agenda Sustainable Development Goals such as ending poverty and hunger, protecting the planet, promoting and fostering peace, achieving gender equality and empowering all women and girls. Then they will present their conclusions by way of writing a blog entry, producing a song, recording a podcast or preparing a digital presentation. These sessions aim to develop not only students' speaking and communication skills but also their social and interpersonal skills, as well as broaden their perspectives on life in the future.

There is a fun, competitive element to Project for the Future and every student in the winning class, judged by the Academic Manager or Centre Director, is recognised for their contribution and given a small prize.

ACADEMIC ENGLISH

The morning Academic English sessions develop the students' English language proficiency across the four skills, with a particular focus on the forms of English which are used and encountered in university settings. These include essay writing, note-taking, lectures, seminars and presentations.

COMMUNICATION SKILLS

These sessions prepare students for life in Higher Education through highly practical workshops that enable more effective methods for high-level oral and written communication. This will be delivered through a wide range of professional and academic contexts, and can involve debating, problem-solving, presenting, essay writing, critical thinking or negotiating.

Bede's Prep and Senior

Bede's offers a year-round co-educational boarding experience for pupils aged 10–18 at both its Prep School on the coast in Eastbourne, and at its Senior School, a short distance away in Upper Dicker. At both schools, our international pupils benefit from our unique educational philosophy, focused on educating the whole person.

Our Prep School educates children through to 13 years. As the boarding community at Bede's Prep is small, it provides a gentle and nurturing experience for our junior boarders who join us for short stays of one term or a year, or longer term as preparation for boarding at our Senior School.

The school offers an ambitious academic programme, which includes EAL support, alongside its highly regarded sporting provision. Creativity in the visual and performing arts is also at the heart of the school, and pupils also benefit from a range of trips and visits throughout the year.

From 13 years of age, pupils move on to the Senior School, which has over 300 boarders who live in five boarding houses, many of which have won awards for design innovation. The campus spans 120 acres and includes impressive sports facilities including a gym, pool and water-based astro, as well as multiple pitches.

All pupils at Bede's have their own personal tutor who supports them during their time at the school, ensuring that they settle in well, are happy in their boarding house and thrive academically.

We offer a wide range of academic subjects including GCSE, A-levels and BTECs. Pupils commonly join the school at Year 9 or Year 12 but we also have a small number of pupils who join in Year 10. Bede's also offers a Pre-Sixth one year GCSE programme, tailored to the needs of pupils who do not speak English as their first language, which acts as the perfect preparation for Sixth Form study.

Bede's is particularly well regarded for its sporting provision, offering academies in football, hockey, cricket and tennis. International pupils benefit from the high level of coaching which is fully integrated into the school day, allowing them to pursue their academic goals and develop English skills alongside.

Our visual and performing arts are also integral to school life and we attract pupils from across the world for our art programme in particular, which allows pupils to study art, design and technology, photography and ceramics through to A-level.

Our boarders enjoy busy weekends with a full programme of social events, trips and activities and are encouraged to take advantage of the cultural and academic enrichment programme offered after school as well.

Bede's is a modern school compared to many British independent schools, and our international students have been a valued part of our community since the school was founded over forty years ago. We continue to highly prize the diversity of our community, and are proud that our alumni community continues to be a truly global one.
