







English preparation and cultural adjustment

pend your summer preparing for admission to a Nova Scotia high school by attending the International Language Institute (ILI). If you qualify academically for entry into the Nova Scotia High School curriculum and complete ILI's 500- Level course, you will be admitted to full-time study at the Shambhala School in Halifax. The ILI qualifying course is equivalent to the B1+ Level of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR).

Prior to arriving in Halifax, ILI will administer a standardized online placement test to determine your current level of English. Your test results will determine if you are ready to take ILI's 500-Level course. If you are not yet ready, the test will indicate how

many weeks of English you may need to prepare for the Shambhala program. Students may enter Shambhala School in September, November, or March. Students seeking full credit are required to attend Shambhala School from September to June.

Morning classes make up ILI's Core Curriculum. Afternoon classes supplement and support the morning classes and focus on individual language skills or exam preparation.

hen you live with an ILI host family, you will share meals in a Canadian household, be introduced to new cultural traditions, practice your English, and experience a Canadian lifestyle. You will also have the comfort of knowing that a caring, responsible adult is available to help you with the many challenges that accompany the adventures of living and studying in a new country.

An ILI host family provides a private room for your exclusive use, three meals a day, sev-

en days a week, laundry facilities, and plenty of great conversation. All families are approved by the Host Family Coordinator and ILI has host families available for students under the age of 19 who require legal guardianship in Canada. Upon your arrival in Halifax, the Coordinator will meet you at the airport, bring you to your new home, and introduce you to your family.
