Why Bristol?

Surrounded by the hills of South West England, Bristol has a unique identity and is home to many artists, musicians, actors and film directors.

It's a university town with over 50,000 full time students and is also home to Wallace & Gromit and Shaun the Sheep!

Bristol is compact enough to get around safely on foot, yet offers a huge variety of cultural activities, international restaurants, festivals (including Europe's largest hot air balloon festival) and shopping. Bristol has a vibrant restaurant scene and has been named the best culinary destination in the world in 2019.

Bristol's history is closely linked to the sea and there are a range of fantastic museums which tell its fascinating story. At the heart of the city is the restored "floating" harbour, where it's possible to sail, paddleboard, enjoy a ferry ride or just walk and enjoy the great views.

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To escape the city, walk across the famous Suspension Bridge to discover 850 acres of woodland and grassland in Ashton Court and Leigh Woods.

Bristol is also close to some of the UK's best and most beautiful places. Bath is only 22km away (you can cycle there using the traffic-free cycle path!) and Oxford, Wales, Stratford-Upon-Avon, Cornwall and Devon are all within easy reach.

London is only 90 minutes by train and it's a 30-minute drive to the city centre from Bristol International Airport.

IH Bristol Junior Centre

Our Junior Centre is located in Clifton, one of Bristol's most popular, elegant and affluent areas. Clifton is one of the oldest neighbourhoods in Bristol and is also home to the University of Bristol; our adult centre is a short walk away.

There are also a number of shops and restaurants a few minutes' walk away, so students can relax in a safe and friendly environment with all the amenities close to the school.

The school has a warm and friendly atmosphere and is fully equipped with comfortable seating, interactive SMART boards, computers and free wi-fi access.

There's a student area and garden for use at breaktimes, and our nearby Queens Avenue centre has a bright and airy students' room which opens up directly onto a private garden - ideal for summer barbecues, parties and outdoor activities, so everyone gets to know each other from their first day.

We have capacity for 120 students across nine classrooms, so as well as offering a junior summer programme for individuals, we can accommodate groups throughout the year.

We also run courses for adults year-round at Queens Avenue.

There's a varied programme of English lessons: grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation and skills (reading, speaking, listening and writing)

As a junior student, you study in mixed-nationality, junior-only groups at our IH Bristol Junior Centre.

All our junior course materials are written by IH Bristol teachers and updated annually, so you definitely won't have seen the same materials in your English lessons at home. We guarantee a unique study experience for our students, taught by teachers who understand the aims and outcomes of these lessons.

FILM MAKING

Students get practical experience in making and editing videos. Students produce an instruction video, an advert, a dialogue, an interview or a pop video for a song of their choice, which they present to the other students in the school on the final day of the course.

DRAMA

Students get practical experience in rehearsing and staging a musical. Lessons focus on choreography, pronunciation of song lyrics, acting and related language input areas. The courses are overseen by drama teachers who have an awareness of both the students' language needs and production issues.

PHOTOGRAPHY

This course offers practical experience and skills in event, nature, architecture, tourism and portrait photography. Students learn new photographic techniques and photo editing and review existing techniques, while learning and practising English related to the subject, all leading up to a presentation on the last day.

JOURNALISM

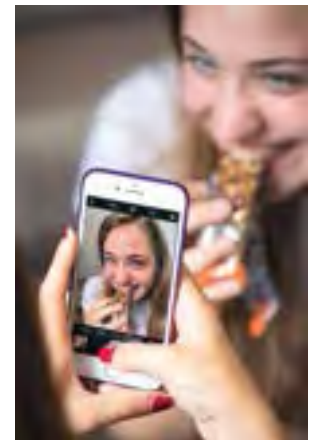
This aims to give students practical experience of producing a class newspaper in English, incorporating many of the typical features of an English-language newspaper

DJING

This course will teach you the basics of becoming a DJ, how to mix, how to select effects, how to produce the right sound and it will give you the techniques needed to create your very own music sample to take away with you.

INTEGRATING COURSES

When there are simultaneous specialist courses running in any of these fields, there can also be an opportunity to connect them. For instance, students can show what they learned in a talent show.



Social Programme

From day one, our social programme offers an excellent chance to practise the English you have learnt in class and it helps you get to know your fellow students a little better.

Each week we organise a varied programme of afternoon and evening activities to make the most of what Bristol has to offer.

Attractions in Bristol are all about the 'B's: we have Brunel, boats, bridges, bikes and beautiful countryside. Everywhere you turn there is something wonderful to see and do in Bristol.

For groups, we can arrange a bespoke programme to combine any of these activities and excursions.

Social Programme events are supervised by IH Bristol teachers and group leaders, with at least one adult supervisor for every 15-20 students.

If students are going on a trip outside the school, each student is given a lanyard with our emergency contact numbers and the teachers' phone numbers on for their safety.

Homestay Accommodation

Our homestay hosts are families, couples and single people. We have chosen them because they have clean, comfortable homes near the school and they offer a friendly welcome to our students.

We want you to feel like one of the family. This is a great way to help you practise your English naturally. We visit all our hosts regularly to make sure the accommodation they offer is of the highest standard.

When you arrive, your host will show you how to get to school on the first morning. Most hosts live within 30 minutes of the school on foot or by public transport.

Homestay hosts provide two meals a day, three at weekends, included in the price of your accommodation. You have a private bedroom with somewhere to put your clothes and a table to work at. Breakfast is provided daily, and you will share evening and weekend meals with members of your homestay; a packed lunch is provided at school. We never put two students who speak the same language in the same home (unless requested), so you will have plenty of opportunity to practise your English and get to know more about the English way of life.

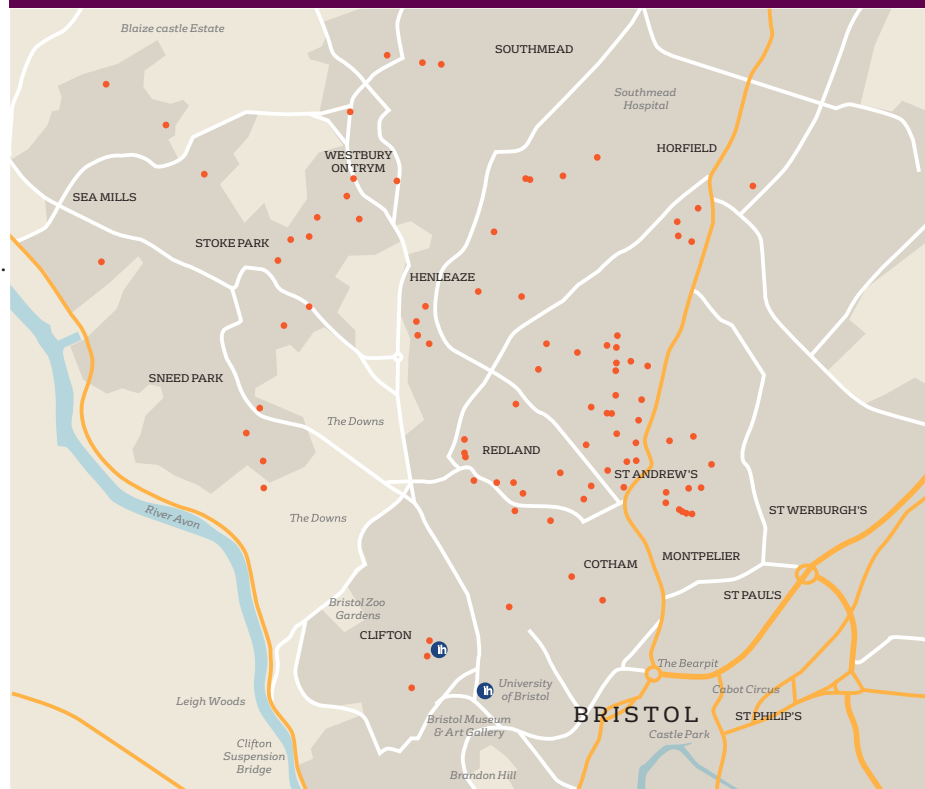
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I lived for four weeks with a family in Clifton who made me feel very welcome and were there for me whenever I needed them. We are still friends to this day!

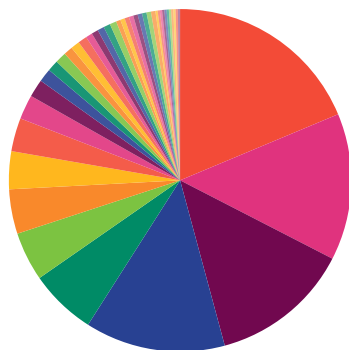
OUR HOMESTAY LOCATIONS
