Organisations can apply for funding to work in partnership with organisations from other participating countries.





### What to expect from English classes:

After an exciting day of cultural activities, our teachers will proceed to work on projects involving the topics covered in the activity to further support in the students learning.

Our English classes are tailored around the chosen itinerary, including topics to further support our student's learning.

Our English classes are an integral part in gaining more knowledge on the theme of Erasmus course chosen.

Our Georgian school building overlooking the Atlantic Ocean has four classrooms. Our teaching methodology is "Project Based Learning", which sees students focused on themes and being engaged and enthused to learn. We want every student who comes to DELS to leave with a sense of accomplishment and to create some wonderful memories and lifelong friends.

Classes comprise 15 hours of teaching per week. Classes are split by level. Students have a break during class, which is supervised by our teachers. There is a living room area at the school with Wifi.

Each student is given a report of their progress and a certificate of completion.





### What to expect from Erasmus+ activities:

### **Cultural awareness**

These exciting opportunities enable students to talk to local members of the community who come from a diverse range of backgrounds, learn about charities supporting people with disability and Irelands ethnic minorities.

### **Environment and the future**

Students will have the opportunity to appreciate the local environment by enjoying local walks and beach hikes, as well as learning to preserve the local environment through tree planting and understanding local organic practices. Students will also learn how to calculate their carbon footprint and understand environmental best practices.

### **Digital innovation**

Activities will involve using state-of-the-art facilities in local digital hubs. Workshops will include learning about creating a positive digital footprint.

Activities are engaging and students will have the opportunity to design, create and learn about the exciting world of new technological inventions with experts.

### Citizenship

Students will learn about community, local politics and the importance of getting involved and using your voice. Days out will include trips to community led groups and local political establishments where students can engage in debates and discussions. Workshops will also explain the political system in Ireland and Ireland's unique place in the European Union.


