ENGLISH & HORSE-RIDING PROGRAMME

This programme is available to junior students between the ages of 12 and 17.

The course offers a combination of language tuition in the mornings with horse-riding and cultural activities in the afternoons and evenings.



This programme include:

20 Lessons English Language Tuition Weekly Full-Board Accommodation with a Host Family or University Residence

Weekly Assessment by Teachers

5 Hours Horse-Riding Training Weekly

Afternoon and Evening Social or Cultural Activities

Transfers to and from Cork Airport / Ferry port

End of Course Diploma

Our English & Horse Riding programme is based in Douglas Community School, located in the residential suburb of Douglas, approx 2km from Cork City Centre. It is an extremely well equipped school, with science rooms, language rooms, business room, geography room, practical studies rooms, library, art room, two computer rooms and assembly areas.

The school is also equipped for all sports with two grass playing fields, one all-weather playing field, two tennis courts and a large multi-purpose sports hall.





The spacious classrooms combined with our highly qualified and experienced teachers matched with a magnificient social programme all contribute to form a world class programme for children aged between 12 and 17. So in rain or shine there is plenty to keep the students occupied.

At all times the students are supervised by their own leaders and also are accompanied by an Irish teacher.

ACTIVITIES

Following their morning language classes, students enjoy horse-riding on five hours per week at our Equestrian Centre. Horse-riding is offered at all levels ensuring the programme is suited to ri-ders from beginniner's level to advanced. Under the supervision of professional trainers the students undertake riding, which is catered to their own level, and includes cross country, fun & games and stable management.

Evening activities consist of disco, karaoke and bingo. A full day trip is provided every Saturday to a venue further afield.







Students attend classes in the mornings from 9.00am to 12.15pm. All students language abilities are assessed on arrival and they are placed in classes with students of a similar level.

Classes are interactive and the main focus is on improving the students' spoken ability and vocabulary expansion. A progress test every Friday ensures that the progress of each student is monitored on an ongoing basis. CEC teachers are native English speakers and fully qualified in the teaching of English as a foreign language. All possess a primary degree in addition to TEFL qualifications. Our Junior Centres are recognised by the Irish Dept. of Education. The use of course materials is included in the course price. The average number of students per class is 10-12 with a maximum of 15. Students are supervised by group leaders and CEC teachers at all times.

ACCOMMODATION

Host Family

Students reside with carefully selected Irish host families . Accommodation is on a full board basis.

OR

Residential

Students can stay in our university residence in a single room with shared bathroom. Accommodation is on a full board basis
